- b. i. Attempt a postcolonial reading of *The Tempest*.

- ii. Critically examine the theme of morality in *Measure for Measure*.
- c. i. Edmund in *King Lear* is a villain without a conscience. Do you agree? Give reasons in support of your answer.

Or

- ii. Examine the treatment of the theme of honour in Antony and Cleopatra.
- d. Critically discuss, with reference to the sonnets by Shakespeare prescribed for your study, the relationship between time and love as worked out in these poems.
- e. Discuss *any one* of the following stage conventions of Shakespeare's time:
 - (i) Soliloquies and asides
 - (ii) Cross-dressing
 - (iii) Exits and entrances
- f. Critically discuss the contribution of any one of the following critics to Shakespearean criticism: (a) Charles Lamb (b) William Hazlitt (c) A. C. Bradley (d) G. Wilson Knight (e) T.S.Eliot

a. i. Comment briefly on the gulling of Malvolio in Twelfth Night.

- c. Write a short note on the reunion of Lear and Cordelia in Shakespeare's *King Lear*.
- d. On what grounds do Philo and Demetrius fault Antony in the opening scene of *Antony and Cleopatra*?
- e. Comment critically on any two instances of reversal of Petrarchan conventions in Shakespeare's Sonnet 130.
