THE BURDWAY UNIVERSITY ACT, 1981

[Passed by the West Bengal Legislature]

[Assent of the Governor was first published in the Calcuta Gazetter Extraordinary, of the 10th August, 1981]

Ar. 4rd to provide for the reconstitution of the University of Burdwan and for vertain matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Whitees it is expedient to reconstitute the University of Burdwan to enable it to function more efficiently as a University encouraging and providing for instruction, teaching, training and research in various branches of learning and courses of study, promoting advancement and dissemination of knowledge and learning, and extending higher education to meet the growing needs of society and to make the constitution of various authorities or bodies of the University more democratic;

It is hereby enacted in the Thirty-second Year of the Republic of India, by the Legislature of West Bengal, as follows :-

CHAPTER I

PRELIMINARY

Short title and

1. (1) This Act may be called the Burdwan University Act, 1981.

(2) This section and section 52 shall come into force at once; and the remaining provisions of this Act shall come into force on such date or dates as the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint, and different dates may be appointed for different provisions of this Act.

to the University of Burdwan as constituted prior to the appointed day and conversity of Burdwan as constituted prior to the appointed day and continue as such immediately before such day or affiliated to the University under this Act;

- (2) "appointed day" means the date referred to in sub-section (5) of section 57:
- (3) "constituent college" means an affiliated college in which instruction is provided, under prescribed conditions, for honours as well as for post-graduate courses of study, and which is declared as such by the University;

Provided that, if in any professional subject no honours courses of study have been prescribed, a professional college may be a constituent college although no instruction is provided in that college for honours courses of study in that subject;

- (4) "convocation" means a meeting of the Court for the purpose of conferring degrees, titles, diplomas, certificates or other academic distinctions;
- (5) "district" means any of the districts of Bankura, Birbhum, Burdwan, Hooghly and Purulia or any district which may be created in future out of any part or parts of one or more of the above mentioned districts:
- (6) "employee" in relation to the University means any person employed by the University;
 - (7) "financial year" means the year ending on the 31st day of March;
- (8) "Government College" means a college maintained and managed by the State Government;
 - (9) "Governor" means the Governor of the State of West Bengal;
- (10) "Hall" or "Hostel" means a unit of residence for students, teachers, officers or non-teaching staff recognised by the University;

Note: Provisions of sections 2 to 7 came into force on the 22nd July. 1983 [Vide West Bengal Act XVII of 1983]

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(25) "University Professor", "University Reader", or "University Lecturer" means a Professor, Reader or Lecturer appointed or recognised as such by the University.

CHAPTER II

THE UNIVERSITY AND ITS OFFICERS

- 3. (1) The first Chancellor and the first Vice-Chancellor of the University and the first members of the Court and the Executive Council and all persons who may hereafter become the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor of the University or the members of the Court or the Executive Council so long as they continue to hold such office or membership, shall constitute a body corporate by the name of the University of Burdwan.
- (2) The University shall have perpetual succession and a common seal and shall sue and be sued by the name of the University of Burdwan.

Powers of the 4. The University shall have the following University powers, namely:—

- to provide for instruction and training in such branches of learning as it may think fit and to make provisions for research and for the advancement and dissemination of knowledge;
- (2) to establish, maintain and manage colleges, libraries, museums and such other institutions or centres as it may consider fit;
- (3) to recognise any college as a constituent college or a professional college and to withdraw such recognition;
- (4) to affiliate to itself or to recognise colleges or institutions or centres;

Note : Provisions under sections 3.to 5 came into force on the 15th April, 1984 [Vide Notification No. 433-Edn.(U) dated 30.3.1984 issued by the State Govt.] 6

*(5) to prescribe for colleges other than Government colleges,-

- (a) the constitution, powers and functions of their Governing Bodies; and
- (b) the terms and conditions of service of-
- (i) Librarians, and
- (ii) non-teaching staff;
- (6) to prescribe for colleges the rules for Teachers' Councils:

(7) to provide for the inspection or investigation into the affairs of colleges or institutions or centres recognised by it or affiliated to it and to exercise general supervision and control over them;

(8) to take over for a period not exceeding twelve months the management of any affiliated, constituent or professional college, institution or centre other than a Government College, institution or centre in order to ensure that proper standard of teaching, training or instruction is maintained therein:

Provide that the University may, if it considers it necessary so to do, extend such period so, however, that the aggregate period shall not exceed eighteen months;

(9) to dissolve the Governing Body of any affiliated, constituent or professional college or institution or centre other than a Government College and pending reconstitution of the Governing Body thereof in such manner as may be prescribed to appoint an Administrator or an ad hoc Governing Body:

Provided that reconstitution of the Governing Body shall be made within a period of twelve months from the date of its dissolution;

Provided further that the University may, if it considers necessary so to do, extend such period so, however, that the aggregate period shall not exceed eighteen months:

- (10) to institute degrees, titles, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions;
- (11) to hold examinations and to confer degrees, titles, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions to person who,—
- * indicates the provisions of clauses (a) and (b) of sub-section (5) amended [vide west Bengal Act XVII of 1983]

- Explanation II: Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Act, a regular student elected under this clause shall hold office for a period of three years from the date of his election or till he ceases to be a regular student, whichever is earlier;
- (xxii) one Research Scholar or Research Fellow of the University elected by such Research Scholars and Research Fellows in the manner prescribed;
- Explanation I: "Research Scholar or Research Fellow of the University" shall mean a whole-time Research Scholar or Research Fellow of the University who receives a stipend from the University;
- Explanation II: Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Act, a Research Scholar or a Research Fellow of the University elected under this clause shall cease to hold office on the expiration of the term of Research Scholarship or Research Fellowship, as the case may be;
- (xxiii) one member to be elected by the Librarians of the University and of the colleges affiliated to the University from amongst themselves;
- (xxiv) three members elected by the members of the Nonteaching staff of the University from amongst themselves;
- (xxv) two members elected by the members of the Nonteaching staff of the colleges affiliated to the University from amongst themselves;
- (xxxi) one member elected by the Officers of the University from amongst themselves;
- (c) nominated members—
- (xxvii) four persons to be nominated by the State Government of whom:
 - (a) one shall be a member of a registered trade union within the territorial jurisdiction of the University,
 - one shall be a member of a peasants' association within the territorial jurisdiction of the University,

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- (c) one shall be a member of a primary school teachers' association within the territorial jurisdiction of the University, and
- (d) one shall be member of a secondary school teachers' association within the territorial jurisdiction of the University;
- (xxxiii) one person nominated by the Government of India in the Ministry of Steel, Mines and Fuel;
- (xxix) three persons having special interest in University or technological education nominated by the Chancellor,
- (xxx) the Principal, Hooghly Mohsin College and the Principal, Durgapur Government College, by rotation.
- (2) All elections to the Court shall be held in the manner prescribed by Statutes.
- 18. (1) Subject to such conditions as may be provided by or under

- (xvi) the Principal, Hooghly Mohsin College and the Principal, Durgapur Government College, by rotation.

- (2) All elections to the Executive Council shall be held in the manner prescribed by Statutes.



In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of Section 26 read with clause (j) of Section 12 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017, had been notified in the Gazette of India on 23.06.2017. The first and the second amendment in the principal regulations were notified in the Gazette of India on 11.10.2017 and 06.02.2018 respectively.

- 2. Part-II; sub-regulations (3) to (5); of the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 describes the Recognition process of Higher Educational Institutions for offering Open and Distance Learning programmes. The sub-regulations (3) describes the process of recognition of Higher Educational Institutions offering programmes in Open and Distance Learning Mode, whereas sub-regulations (4) describes the process for withdrawal of recognition and sub-regulations (5) provides right to appeal to Higher Educational Institutions aggrieved with the decision of the Commission.
- 3. The Commission had invited online applications from the eligible Higher Educational Institutions for offering Open and Distance Learning programmes from the academic session 2018-19 vide public notice F.No. 74-1/2018 (DEB-IV) dated 28.03.2018, mentioning therein that the online portal for submitting applications shall-be open from 2nd April, 2018 to 1nd May, 2018. It was also mentioned that the duly certified hard copies of the application submitted online mode along with annexures shall reach UGC (DEB) office at 35 Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi-110001 within 10 working days of submission of online application. In response to the public notice dated 28.03.2018, University of Burdwan, had submitted application online for programme wise recognition by the Commission.

- 4. Application received from University of Burdwan had been scrutinized by the expert committee and deficiency(s) or defect(s) in application were communicated and time period as prescribed in University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 was given to remove or rectify such deficiency(s) or defect(s) with relevant documentary evidence.
- 5. University of Burdwan was invited for an Interface Meeting with the Expert Committee; constituted by the Chairman of the Commission; on 06, July, 2018 in the UGC office, Bahadurshah Zafar Marg, New Delhi. The Expert Committee based on the application submitted, clarification given for deficiency(s) or defect(s)communicated earlier, the presentation made by the Higher Educational Institution in the Interface Meeting and in terms of provisions of the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments; made recommendations for consideration of the Commission.
- 6. The Commission in its 534th meeting held on '2nd August, 2018 considered the recommendations of the interface expert committee. Sir/Madam,

This is in continuation to the UGC Orders of even number dated 16.08.2018 and 18.10 2018, wherein the details of programmes recognized for 2018-19 onwards and programmes not recognized were communicated to University of Burdwan, West Bengal.

- 2. As per the provisions under sub-regulation (5) of part-II of the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning 2017) Regulations and the decision of the Commission it is 535th meeting held on 27th September, 2018, for the programmes not recognized as per the UGC letter cited in above Para, the Higher Educational Institution had been provided an opportunity to submit an appeal along with requisite fee and documentary evidence, if any within 30 days from the date of the said UGC letter.
- 3. The appeal along with documents submitted by the University of Burdwan, West Bengal was placed before duly constituted Standing Appellate Committee in the meeting held on 11th December,2018, at UGC, 35 Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi. The Standing Appellate Committee based on the appeal submitted along with documentary evidences, interaction with the HEI Authorities and the provisions of the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments; made recommendations for consideration of the Competent Authority, in accordance to the Commission decision, in its 534th meeting, held on 02.08.2018.
- 4. Based on the decision of the Competent Authority, I am directed to issue this Order, thereby communicating the decision of the Commission, on the appeal received, for offering programmes in Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode from academic year 2018-19, session beginning January, 2019 and onwards by the University of Burdwan, West Bengal, as detailed in point no. 5 below.

For the programmes recognized in 5(A) above, the Higher Educational Institution shall scrupulously abide in letter and spirit by all the terms and conditions, while offering the programmes in Open and Distance Learning mode, as per the provisions detailed in Part-III, Part-IV, Part-V, Part-VI and Annexure-I to Annexure-XI of the University Grants Commission (Open & Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments. Some specific conditions given in UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017 & its amendments are given in Annexure-1.
- 7. If the HEI fails to comply with the conditions of recognition or if it is found conducting affairs in a manner that leads to deterioration of academic standards, or if any information, documentary evidence submitted/produced by the HEI is found to be false or fake at a later date, UGC shall take action as per Regulation (4) Part II of UGC (ODL) Regulations, 2017.

 Time limit for completion of admission process for offering ODL programmes by HEIs:

The Commission in its 537th meeting held on 10.12.2018 has decided the time limit for completion of admission process by the HEIs for offering ODL programmes as mentioned below:

 Academic session for July - admission last date August end

The Commission has also directed that the HEIs shall upload the admission details within ten days from the last date of the admissions in the respective academic session i.e. 10th September for July academic session and 10th March for January academic session. Accordingly, the HEIs shall comply with the above decision of Commission.





In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of Section 26 read with clause (j) of Section 12 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017, had been notified in the Gazette of India on 23.06.2017. The first and the second amendment in the principal regulations were notified in the Gazette of India on 11.10.2017 and 06.02.2018 respectively.

- 2. Part-II; sub-regulations (3) to (5); of the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 describes the Recognition process of Higher Educational Institutions for offering Open and Distance Learning programmes. The sub-regulations (3) describes the process of recognition of Higher Educational Institutions offering programmes in Open and Distance Learning Mode, whereas sub-regulations (4) describes the process for withdrawal of recognition and sub-regulations (5) provides right to appeal to Higher Educational Institutions aggrieved with the decision of the Commission.
- 3. The Commission had invited online applications from the eligible Higher Educational Institutions for offering Open and Distance Learning programmes from the academic session 2018-19 vide public notice F.No. 74-1/2018 (DEB-IV) dated 28.03.2018, mentioning therein that the online portal for submitting applications shall-be open from 2nd April, 2018 to 1nd May, 2018. It was also mentioned that the duly certified hard copies of the application submitted online mode along with annexures shall reach UGC (DEB) office at 35 Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi-110001 within 10 working days of submission of online application. In response to the public notice dated 28.03.2018, University of Burdwan, had submitted application online for programme wise recognition by the Commission.

- 4. Application received from University of Burdwan had been scrutinized by the expert committee and deficiency(s) or defect(s) in application were communicated and time period as prescribed in University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 was given to remove or rectify such deficiency(s) or defect(s) with relevant documentary evidence.
- 5. University of Burdwan was invited for an Interface Meeting with the Expert Committee; constituted by the Chairman of the Commission; on 06, July, 2018 in the UGC office, Bahadurshah Zafar Marg, New Delhi. The Expert Committee based on the application submitted, clarification given for deficiency(s) or defect(s)communicated earlier, the presentation made by the Higher Educational Institution in the Interface Meeting and in terms of provisions of the University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning) Regulations, 2017 and its amendments; made recommendations for consideration of the Commission.
- 6. The Commission in its 534th meeting held on '2nd August, 2018 considered the recommendations of the interface expert committee. Based on the decision of the Commission, I am directed to issue this Order, thereby communicating the programme wise recognition status of the programmes to be offered in Open and Distance Learning mode from academic year 2018-19 onwards by the University of Burdwan as detailed in point no. 7 below.



The University of Burdwan, a public university located in PurbaBardhaman, West Bengal, was established by the west Bengal Government as A teaching and affiliating University on 15th June, 1960. way back in 1994 when, the Higher Education Department Govt. West Bengal was searching for a State-aided University who would like to introduce Distance/ Correspondence Education in the State and the University of Burdwan was the first to shoulder the responsibility. In a meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Vice-Chancellors of all state aided universities of West Bengal held on 27.10.1993, it was decided that the University of Burdwan will introduce Correspondence Courses (Vide letter no. 96(2)-Edn (U)/ 1U(C)-14/92,dated: 22.02.1994). Accordingly, the University of Burdwanreadily accepted the proposal to introduce the P.G courses through correspondence mode. In the 21st meeting of the Executive Council (1993-1994)of Burdwan University[held on 30th may 1994 vide Item no. 333 A.O.M (8)], it was resolved that The university of Burdwan in accordance with its Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations and with the approval of the State Govt. offered through Distance mode P.G. Courses leading to M.A./M.Com. Degrees with six programmes, viz., Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce. Later, B.Ed. 1)Programme Mission and Objectives:

- B. Ed programme plays a vital role for strengthening skills and capabilities for the teachers. A large number of educational institutes of India exclusively dealing with teacher education development. But considering the vastness of demand more options are to be tried and so that each and every child get the benefit of education through qualified teachers. This programme of DDE, B.U aims at developing the understanding the competencies required by a teacher for effective teaching learning process at the secondary stage. It enables the teachers to select and organize learning experiences according to the requirements of the learner.
 - To develop skills required in selecting organized instructional design and strategies for effective teaching.
 - To develop skills required in selecting and organizing learning experiences.
 - To develop skills involved in selecting developing and using evaluation tools.
 - To acquire knowledge and develop an understanding of various aspects of school management.
 - To develop competencies for organizing various instructional and student support activities.

2)Relevance of the Programme with HEI's Mission & Goals:

5.INSTRUCTIONAL DESIGN (B.Ed):

Some courses at CDOE, B.U are being run in accordance with the advice of the UGC (DEB) that at least 50% of the disciplines taught in the distance learning must be with the same syllabus and same examination system of the regular course of the university. However B.Ed is not one of them. B.Ed is being conducted following the Term End Examination method whereby the total curriculam consists of 1400 marks (takeing into account both Part-I & PartII).

I)CURRICULUM DESIGN:

IV.Candidates who have complete D.EL.ED. (2 years face to face mode) under ODL mode and Montessori are not eligible for this programme.

Total Course fee:Rs. 50,000/- (Excluding Examination and Re-appearing fees).

Financial Assistance: Financial assistance is not provided to the students for this programme.

Curriculum transaction:

SLMs (Bengali version) in print are provided as approved by B.O.S of the Directorate. PCP/Counselling schedules for the programme are prepared by Course Co-ordinator with the assistance of the core faculty. PCP/Counselling schedules circulated among the study centres as well as notified in the official website of the Directorate. During this session, teachers will help the students with their course work. PCP/Counselling are conducted in B.Ed.

Medium of Examination: Bengali/ English.

Evaluation: Term-end Examinations (written) 30% of the total marks of the paper are Assignment (For General Papers).70% of the total marks of the paper would be reserved for written examination (For General Papers), 100% marks for Method Papers, Micro-Teaching, Workshop and Practical/ Book Review to be held at the end of the 1st year (Part – I) & at the end of 2nd year (Part - II).

A few notable features of the rules governing the examination of B.Ed. programme under distance mode:

a) A B.Ed. (Two-year) programme shall be equally divided into two parts as per the approved syllabus in the subject concerned: Part – I and Part – II, each spanning one academic year. The Part –I Examination under these Regulations shall be held at the end of the first academic year after the commencement of the session and the Part – II Examination shall be held at the end of the second academic year.

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- b) A Candidate shall have to complete Part I & Part II examination within four consecutive years including his/ her enrolment in Part - I Examination subject to the conditions that not more than three consecutive chances shall be allowed in each part. Credit will be allowed paper-wise as well as partwise and will be retained for four consecutive years If any of the chances mentioned above is not availed by a candidate within the stipulated period, the chance shall be deemed to have lapsed.
- To pass the B.Ed. examination a candidate shall have to secure a c) minimum 40% marks in aggregate (Part - I & Part - II examination taken together) and have secure paper-wise as well as part-wise minimum qualifying marks.

15. Requirement of the laboratory support and Library Resources:

The students may avail the library facilities at the Directorate. Directorate has a wellequipped Library in HQ at Burdwan.

16. Cost estimate of the Programme and the provisions:

Upon receipt of approval from the UGC/DEB, the Finance Committee may set aside budgetary provisions towards Programme Development, Programme Delivery, Programme Maintenance. Once the Programmes are operational, fee receipts from the Programme may be used to cover the same, as per the guidance of the Syndicate and Finance Committee.

Accordingly, the University of Burdwan readily accepted the proposal to introduce the P.G courses through correspondence mode. In the 21st meeting of the Executive Council (1993-1994) of Burdwan University (held on 30th may 1994 vide Item no.333(A.O.M) (8), it was resolved that the university of Burdwan in accordance with its Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations and with the approval of the State Govt. be offered P.G Courses through Distance mode leading to M.A/M.Com degrees with six programmes, viz., Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce. Within a short span of time it has become a lighthouse of learning for persons of all ages and gender, particularly to such persons, who for different reasons cannot avail the higher course of studies as regular fulltime students.

The University of Burdwan has been introduced PG programme in Bengali under Directorate of Open and Distance Learning (DODL) mode of Education since 1994 with a view to promote the holistic development through academic excellence, employability, acquisition of analytical skills and higher research. It intends to promote the discipline of Bengali and motivate the students to thrive in Bengali.

Bengali known by its synonym Bangla is an Indo Aryan language predominantly spoken in West Bengal. It is the regional language of West Bengal. It also has a strong literary base. Outstanding enrichment in Bengali literature is noted since Bengali Renaissance with contributions of Bankim Chadra Chattyapadhya, Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar, Rabindranath Tagore, Sharat Chandra Chattyopadhya, Tarashankar Bandyapadhya and others.

Different courses in Bengali language and literature may provide opportunity to explore linguistic and development of Bengali literature, Bengali literature in different periods, sociology of literature, novel, short stories, poetry, essay and play, women's writing in Bengali, literature in translation, comparative study (Post colonialism & post modernism), linguistic studies etc.

Preparation of SLMs

In 1999 first 3 Day workshop was organized by our Directorate with the financial Assistance of DEC. In this workshop all regular faculty members of our university as well as other Universities were participated. Prof. V. S. Prasad, former Pro-Vice-Chancellor of IGNOU and Dr. Santosh Panda, Director, STRIDE was acted as Resource persons in the said workshop. Then several subject-wise seminars and workshops were organized by the Directorate of Distance Education (DDE), Burdwan University (B.U) in this regard. Accordingly, as per direction of university authority a number of writers for SLMs of all the subjects/programmes were appointed, and also Editorial Boards, Format Editors and General Editors of all the subjects/programmes were formed by the direction of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. The entire process was approved by the Advisory Committee of DDE, B.U. and Vice-Chancellor. After Publication of the SLMs following such a manner, two sets of all study materials were sent to DEC for approval as per their direction. In February, 2013, an Expert Team from DEC was visited our Directorate and the members thoroughly checked all study materials and they appreciated the whole process. In view of their recommendation, few months later, the letter of recognition of the programmes as well as approval of SLMs was sent by DEB (Vide letter no. UGC/DEB/Recog/2013/1203-1207, dated: 21st August, 2015).

Way back in 1994 when, the Higher Education Department Govt. West Bengal was searching for a State-aided University who would like to introduce Distance/ Correspondence Education in the State and the University of Burdwan was the first to shoulder the responsibility. In a meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Vice-Chancellors of all state aided universities of West Bengal held on 27.10.1993, it was decided that the University of Burdwan will introduce Correspondence Courses (Vide letter no. 96(2)-Edn (U)/ 1U(C)-14/92, dated: 22.02.1994). Accordingly, the University of Burdwanreadily accepted the proposal to introduce the P.G courses through correspondence mode. In the 21st meeting of the Executive Council (1993-1994) of Burdwan University (held on 30th may 1994 vide Item no. 333(AOM)),it was resolved that The university of Burdwan in accordance with its Act, Statutes. Ordinances, Rules and Regulations and with the approval of the State Govt. be offered P.G Courses through Distance mode leading to M.A/M.Com Degrees with six programmes, viz., Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce. Later, M.Sc Programme in Computer Science was introduced from the academic session 2008-2010as per decision with the meeting of the departmental committee of Computer Science, B.U. and the Executive Council was approved the same in its meeting dated 23.04.2008 (vide Item No.316).

The Executive Council of The University of Burdwan in its meeting on 19.01.2021 passed the resolution to rename 'The Directorate of Distance Education' as per UGC Notification (4th September 2020) to 'Centre for Distance and Online Education(CDOE)'. Accordingly, the matter has been placed before the court for approval.

1. Programme Mission and Objectives:

To provide subject to fulfillment of minimum eligibility criteria and other requirements as may be prescribed by the university from time to time, wider access to higher education to persons of all ages and sexes residing in any part of the country – particularly to working persons – who, for different reasons, cannot avail the opportunity of higher study as regular full-time students of an university. To provide a system of student-centric learning atmosphere which will neither be entirely separated from nor wholly independent of the formal, full-time campus system of education as traditionally followed in university department of studies.

The Post Graduate Programme in Computer Science at the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) (Previously Known as Directorate of Distance Education), The University of Burdwan is keeping the same curricula with regular mode of University i.e. CBCS system of M.Sc. in Computer Science. The objectives are in keeping with this mission i.e., to instill interest in the learners and make them ready for industry and academia.M.ScProgramme in Computer Science was introduced from the academic session 2008-2010 as per decision with the meeting of the departmental committee of Computer

Science, B.U. and the Executive Council was approved the same in its meeting dated 23.04.2008 (vide Item No.316).

2. Relevance of the Programme with HEI's Mission & Goals:

The P.G Programme in Computer Science needs little justification when it comes to ascertaining its relevance to the Programme offered by any HEL. The P.G Programme at CDOE has also kept in touch with the curriculum of the regular mode of the University. Hence, the goal of the introduction of such programme is to equip the distance learners with the best of existing knowledge as well as making them ready for the job market.

3. Nature of Prospective Target Group of Learners:

It addresses the personalized needs of the learners under low level of disposable income, rural dwellers, women, unskilled men, minorities, working professionals etc. Students who graduated themselves and also do not find an opportunity to go for post graduate studies in regular mode of education due to the limitation of sets. The CDOE of The University of Burdwan will offer them the best opportunity by offering the subject at post graduate level. The 2-yr. P.G Programme in Computer Science offered to B.Sc. Hons. in Computer Science/BCA/B.E. or equivalent or B.Sc. Hons. in Mathematics/Statistics/Electronics/Physics/Chemistry with Computer Science as one of the combination or DOEACC A-Level or its equivalent or PGDCA from State Council of Technical Education of Govt. of West Bengal.

4. Appropriateness of programme to be conducted in Open and Distance Learning and/or

Online mode to acquire specific skill and competence:

This programme will help the learners to spread higher education in all sectors of community. Capacity building among the students particularly from the rural population as well as backward areas of the districts. The distance learning under The University of Burdwan offer programme in an expanded mode both in volume and the type of programmes. As technology has been getting more affordable and widely available, the interest of both learners and institutions in this special kind of education may be increased enormously.

Curriculum Design:

The curriculum of M. A. in English is designed by a committee comprising experts from the parent department of The University of Burdwan along with external experts keeping in view of the needs of its diverse groups of learners. The syllabus is prepared by the Subject Committee namely Post Graduate Board of Studies (PGBS) and is placed in the Advisory Committee of CDOE for approval. The syllabus is then uploaded in the website of the university.

• Syllabus and Examination: In the 538th meeting of UGC-DEB held on 19.01.2019, the DEB has taken an important decision that the dual mode HEI's shall conduct common examination (same question aper) for 50% of the total recognized programmes from the academic session July 2019 onwards. In compliance with the above decision, the CDOE, of The University of Burdwan, has introduced the same syllabus and examination system as per the regular course of the University for 50% of the total number of its programmes. However, the M.A. programme in English does not fall into this category. This programme is being conducted as per the old syllabus and mode of examination.

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Student Support Service System: Students are facilitated to contact the faculty members and the office by phone or email or in person. In view of their recommendation, in 2015, the letter of approval for the SLMs was sent by DEB, New Delhi.

6. Procedure for Admission, Curriculum Transaction and Evaluation:

Admission Procedure: The Notification for admission in M.A programme in English is published in leading newspapers and the official Website of CDOE. The Whole Admission Procedure is carried out through online mode.

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Eligibility:

- > A minimum of 2nd class Hons. (Regular or Special) Graduate in the relevant subject having pursued the course in the 10+2+3 pattern from any recognized University, or
- > An unsuccessful Hons. Graduate of the above pattern, who after having pursued the Hons. Course for 3 years has ended up in obtaining a Pass Certificate Degree securing at least 35% marks in aggregate, or
- > A minimum of 2nd class Hons. (Regular or Special) graduate in the relevant subject having pursued the course of the old 11+3 pattern, or
- > A Pass Graduate in the 10+2+3 pattern being offered the relevant subject as a combination / elective one (of not less than 300 marks at the degree level) and securing at least 30% marks in it, or,
- > B.Sc, / B.Com. / B.A. Pass Graduates who subsequently passed Special B.A. (of not less than 300 marks in the relevant subject) securing at least 30% marks in it, or
- > A pass graduate in the 10+2+2 / 10+1+3 / 11+3 pattern from any recognized institute who subsequently passed 1 year Bridge Course in the relevant subject (of not less than 300 marks at the degree level) and thus became equivalent to a pass graduate of 10+2+3 pattern securing at least 40% marks in it, or
- > An M.A. willing to do M.A.in a subject through distance mode irrespective of whether or not that subject was offered to him / her at the degree level. No Master's degree in any professional subject like Music, Drama, Film Studies, Physical Education (M.P.Ed.), General Education (M.Ed.) etc. is entitled to this special provision.
- > Students who have acquired master's degree in any subject except professional subjects are also eligible for admission in the said programme.

Total Course fee:

Rs. 10000/- (excluding Examination and Re-appearing fees).

Financial Assistance:

CDOE also has provision for financial assistance. Willing financially weak students can seek financial assistance for pursuing the programme.

Curriculum Transaction:

SLMs (both soft copy and hard copy) are provided to the students. 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Programme Project Report (PPR) for M.A in History (2022-2023)

Way back in 1994 when, the Higher Education Department Govt. West Bengal was searching for a State-aided University who would like to introduce Distance/ Correspondence Education in State and the University of Burdwan was the first to shoulder the responsibility. In a meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Vice-Chancellors of all state aided universities of West Bengal held on 27.10.1993, it was decided that the University of Burdwan will introduce Correspondence Courses (Vide letter no. 96(2)-Edn (U)/ 1U(C)-14/92, dated: 22.02.1994). Accordingly, the University of Burdwan readily accepted the proposal to introduce the P.G courses through correspondence mode. In the 21st meeting of the Executive Council (1993-1994) of Burdwan University (held on 30th May 1994 vide Item no. 333 (AOM)(8), it was resolved that the university of Burdwan in accordance with its Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations and with the approval of the State Govt. be offered P.G Courses through Distance mode leading to M.A/M.Com Degrees with six programs, viz., Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce. However, we would like to inform that the court approved the rename of the Directorate of Distance Education as Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) as per UGC notification dated 4th September 2020.

A. Programme Mission and Objectives:

To provide subject to fulfillment of minimum eligibility criteria and other requirements as may be prescribed by the university from time to time, wider access to higher education to persons of all ages and sexes residing in any part of the country – particularly to working persons – who, for different reasons, cannot avail the opportunity of higher study as regular full-time students of a university. To provide a system of student-centric learning atmosphere which will neither be entirely separated from nor wholly independent of the formal, full-time campus system of education as traditionally followed in university department of studies.

The Post Graduate Programme in History at the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), The University of Burdwan is in keeping with sprit of History curricula with regular mode of University. The teaching-learning process of history is closely

related to the study of past not simply for the past alone; it aims to understand the present also in a critical manner. The mission and objective of the program is to motivate the prospective learners to get acquainted with the latest findings as well as research methodology of history as a discipline. The objectives are in keeping with this mission i.e., to instill interest in the learner and take him through the ages of literary history via their landmark authors and their texts. The Programme was started on and from 1994 (academic session 1993-1995).

B. Relevance of the Programme with HEI's Mission & Goals:

The relevance of the PG course in History under ODL mode of Education will provide the connectivity between the Institution and the learners, the identification and nurturing of talent, research in the field of pedagogy for development of efficient learning process for the learners. Focusing on rural economy and the need and aspirations of the youth in the region is one of the missions of the University Of Burdwan and it tries to encourage student enrolment from among weaker sections, even beyond the reservation limit. Regular Mode of Education is not sufficient enough to reach this goal. Introducing Post Graduate Course in History through distance mode of education we can reach to the unreached. The P.G Programme in History needs little justification when it comes to ascertaining its relevance to the Programme offered by any HEI. The P.G Programme at our CDOE has also kept in touch with the curriculum of the regular mode of the University. Hence, the goal of the introduction of such programme is to equip the distance learners with the best of existing knowledge as well as making them ready for the job market.

C. Nature of Prospective Target Group of Learners:

It aims for the development of knowledge modules having the right content to take care of the aspirations of academic community and to address to the personalized needs of the learners under low level of disposable income, rural dwellers, women, unskilled men, minorities etc. Students who graduated themselves and also do not find an apportunity to go for post graduate studies in regular mode of education due to the limitation of seats. We will offer them the best of the opportunity by offering the subject at post graduate level. However, the 2-yr. P.G Programme in History offered to

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History Hons., General Graduates with English as combination and M.A in a subject willing to M.A in History except M.A in any Professional subject.

- D. Appropriateness of the programme to be conducted in the ODL mode of acquiring specific skills and competence: Burdwan university emphasized in innovative approach towards curriculum designing, while conforming to the basic or core requirements to create a common knowledge base for the state and the nation. Post graduate programme in History to be offered through ODL mode will have certain learning outcomes. This programme will help the learners to spread higher education n all sectors of community.

E. Instructional Design: History:

- I) Curriculum design and detailed syllabus: The curriculum design and detailed syllabus will be found in the annexure.
- II) Duration of program: Minimum two years is required to complete this course within four years from registration.
- III) Medium of Instruction: Bengali
- IV) Faculty and support staff requirement: The CDOE has recruited one Core Faculty and two Assistant Professors in Dept. of History and non-teaching staff for academic and administrative support for the learners in an effective and cohesive manner. The University also take support from the regular faculty of the University and as well as from the wider academic community from the other universities and colleges. Besides that different experienced external faculty often takes PCP classes in History. Students who will be admitted in this course will also get help from them. PCP, on a regular basis, will be conducted by these experienced faculty members. Resource Persons for the Study Centers to conduct PCP in this course will be selected from the university to maintain the quality of the education as per university grant commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020.

Programme Project Report (PPR) for M.Sc. in Mathematics

The University of Burdwan, a public university located in Purba Bardhaman, West Bengal, was established by the West Bengal Government as a teaching and affiliating university on 15th June, 1960. Since then, this university has flourished as a premiere institute of advanced learning and research. It was the first of its kind in West Bengal to cater education through distance/correspondence mode and eventually, it evolved as an independent centre for learning. Situated in Golapbag, Burdwan, at present, this centre has a beautiful building of its own that houses all the administrative and academic departments. It also holds counselling sessions for the different courses it runs.

In a meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Vice-Chancellors of all state aided universities of West Bengal held on 27.10.1993, it was decided that the University of Burdwan would introduce Correspondence Courses (Vide letter no. 96(2)-Edn (U)/1U(C)-14/92, dated: 22.02.1994). In the 21st meeting of the Executive Council (1993-1994) of The University of Burdwan (held on 30th may 1994 vide Item no. 310(8)), it was resolved that the University of Burdwan in accordance with its Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations and with the approval of the State Govt. P.G Courses through Distance mode leading to M.A/M.Com Degrees with six programmes, viz., Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce would be offered. The Directorate introduced M.A/M.Sc Programme in Mathematics from the academic session 2007-2009 as per decision of the Executive Council considering the feasibility of offering M.A/M.Sc. in Mathematics under DDE in its meeting held on 06.06.2006 vide Item No. AOM-9(iii).

1. Programme's Mission and Objectives:

- To provide an effective alternative path to wider opportunities in education and especially in higher education: There are different categories of potential learners. There are some who never been able to enter into any institution of higher learning. There are some who just need additional knowledge in a particular discipline. There are still others who are in need of refresher courses to cope with the latest development in their perfection. For all of those there is need for distance learning or correspondence education.
- To provide an efficient and less expensive education: Provision of universal schooling is beyond the means of our country. Increasing population and limited resources is the predicament of our educational planners. It is difficult to divert huge sums of money in a developing economy to match the required level of expansion for traditional schooling. Distance education is the only practical alternative.
- To provide education facilities to all qualified and willing persons: The objective of correspondence courses is to provide education facilities to all qualified and willing persons who are unable to join regular university and other courses due to various reasons. For them, there is an incessant search for an alternative system and that system is distance education.

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- To provide opportunities of academic pursuits to educated citizens willing to improve their standard of knowledge: There are many learners, both young and adults, who cannot afford to join the face-to-face system of education due to personal and professional responsibilities. For such type of persons, some provisions have to be made through distance education. Hence, the objective is to provide opportunities to improve the standard of knowledge and learning through continuing education while in employment.
- To provide education facilities to those individuals who look upon education as a life-long activity: Distance education facilities are needed for those individuals who look upon education as a life-long activity or to acquire knowledge in a new area. Because life-long education is emphasized for all stages of life. In this context, the report of the National Policy on Education, 1986 is worthmentioning here.

The NPE-1986 says, "Life-long education is a cherished goal of the educational process. This presupposes universal literacy. Opportunities will be provided to the youth, housewives, agricultural and industrial workers and professionals to continue the education of their choice, at the pace suited

to them. The future thrust will be in the direction of open and distance learning."

The distance learning system must be well-supported with instructional materials, and suitable radio and television programmes in different areas of study. This correspondence education or distance learning is becoming popular and being accepted as an alternative and economical approach to our formal education system.

- To provide a system of student-centric learning atmosphere which will neither be entirely separated from nor wholly independent of the formal, full-time campus system of education as traditionally followed in university department of studies.
- The Post Graduate Programme in Mathematics at the Centre for Distance and Online Education (previously known as Directorate of Distance Education), The University of Burdwan is in keeping with spirit of Mathematics curricula with regular mode of University. The objectives are in keeping with this mission that is to instill interest of the learners and take them through the ages of literary history via their landmark authors and their texts. The Programme was introduced from the academic session 2007-2009 which was approved by the E.C. in its meeting dated: 06.06.2006, Item No: 9 (III).

2. Relevance of the Programme with HEI's Mission & Goals:

With the arrival of the Internet, and introduction of digital technologies into people's homes, physical boundaries, which were the main reason for inefficient communication among people, have started to disappear. Since technology has made such a big leap forward, people have almost entirely lost their subjective ability to distinguish between the real and the virtual world. That said, it becomes clearer how much the business world has changed and how many more changes await in the future. Thus, distance education represents a transitional period for many young and older people, but also an adequate preparation for new challenges that await them in the business world. - Financial constraints are one of the main reasons why most young people cannot afford quality education. Student loans, rent, and other related expenses have proven to be a heavy burden for many individuals and their families in the long run. However, in the last few years, there has been a significant drop in tuition fees, primarily in secondary schools and colleges, due to the introduction of the distance education option. Namely, not only did the tuition fees drop because the school/educational institution's facilities and inventory were no longer used, but the expenses related to food, accommodation and all the other needs students have on a daily basis dropped as well. So, if you don't have enough money for a quality education, you should consider distance education.
- One of the best things about distance learning is the fact that students from all over the world can get any degree they want, which had previously been impossible due to geographical constraints. Things have changed, however, thanks to the Internet and technologies that significantly simplified the application and enrollment process, helping applicants to skip the state administrative protocol.
- One of the hardest things for students is to coordinate between their job and their school responsibilities that are usually time-bound. However, with the flexibility of deadlines for tests and assignments, and the freedom to organize their obligations as they see fit, students can reconcile working and studying for the first time. So, the final product of this benefit for students is the ability to achieve several academic goals at once, and to gain professional experience while still at school.

In accordance with the advice of the UGC Distance Education Bureau that at least 50% of the disciplines taught in the Distance Learning must be with the same syllabus and same examination system of the regular course of the University. Mathematics(M.Sc.) has been selected one such course among all M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. courses run under the aegis of the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), The University of Burdwan and the upgraded syllabus(CBCS) of regular mode in accordance with the latest UGC Guidelines has currently been in force in Mathematics in Distance Mode. Also the same examination system (same question papers, same date of end-term Semester examinations, same Post Graduate Board of Studies(PGBS)) is in force in the distance mode of Mathematics discipline since 2019-2021.

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- 3. 6. Procedure for admissions, curriculum transaction and evaluation:

Admission Procedure: Through Admission Notification published in leading newspapers and through CDOE's Website as well University Website. Whole Admission Procedure is going on through online.

Eligibility: A minimum 2nd Class Hons. (Regular or Special) graduate in Mathematics having pursued the course in the 10+2+3 pattern from any recognized University

Curriculum transaction: SLMs (English version) in print/soft copies are provided as approved by the CDOE. PCP/Counselling schedules circulated among the study centres as well as notified in the official website of the CDOE. PCP/Counselling are conducted in English.

Preparation of SLMs: In 1999 first 3 Day workshop was organized by our Directorate with the financial Assistance of DEC. In this workshop regular faculty members of our University as well as other Universities participated. Prof. V. S. Prasad, former Pro-Vice-Chancellor of IGNOU and Dr. Santosh Panda, Director, STRIDE acted as Resource persons in the said workshop. Then several subject-wise seminars and workshops were organized by the Directorate of Distance Education (DDE), The University of Burdwan(B.U.). Accordingly as per direction of university authority, a number of writers of SLMs of all the subjects/programmes were appointed and also Editorial Boards, Format Editors and General Editors of all the subjects/programmes were formed by the direction of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. The entire process was approved by the Advisory Committee of DDE, B.U. and Vice-Chancellor. After Publication of the SLMs, two sets of all study materials were sent to DEC for approval as per their direction. In February, 2013, an Expert Team from DEC visited our Directorate and the members thoroughly checked all study materials and they appreciated the whole process. In view of their recommendation, few months later, the letter of recognition of the programme as well as approval of SLMs was sent by DEB (Vide letter no. UGC/DEB/Recog/2013/1203-1207, dated: 21st August, 2015).

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A few notable features of the rules governing the examination of Semester System P.G Course under distance mode:

- The examination of M.Sc. is divided into four semester examinations which hold as per schedule notified by Controller of Examinations from time to time after completion of its relevant PCP.
- A candidate shall get three consecutive chances including the original one to appear in a semester, within a total period of four years calculated from the year of admission to the course during which he she has to complete the course. The chance not availed of by a candidate shall be deemed to have lapsed. The result of the 4th semester(Final) examination shall be kept withheld(RW) unless the candidate has cleared all the previous semesters.

Updated notification for its learners: CDOE notifies its various policies for the programme delivery along with the details of methods and web-based tools adopted in the official website. All academic notifications are being carried out by the CDOE during the academic session through the official website (www.ddc.buruniv.ac.in) and to the learners through SMS. Further, the CDOE notifies result and related information of examination evaluation through its official website and registered mobile number of the learners.

Programme Outcomes (PO's)

Programme outcomes describe what students are expected to know or be able to do by the time of Post Graduation. The M.A./M.Sc. in Mathematics is a two-year, four-semester programme under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). Way back in 1994 when the Higher Education Department, Govt. West Bengal was searching for a State-aided University that would like to introduce Distance/ Correspondence Education in the State, the University of Burdwan was the first to shoulder the responsibility. In a meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Vice-Chancellors of all state aided universities of West Bengal held on 27.10.1993, it was decided that the University of Burdwan will introduce Correspondence Courses (Vide letter no. 96(2)-Edn (U)/ 1U(C)-14/92, dated: 22.02.1994). Accordingly, the University of Burdwan readily accepted the proposal to introduce the P.G courses through correspondence mode. In the 21st meeting of the Executive Council (1993-1994) of Burdwan University (held on 30th may 1994 vide Item no. 8), it was resolved that The University of Burdwan in accordance with its Act. Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations and with the approval of the State Govt. would offer P.G. Courses through Distance mode leading to M.A/M.Com Degrees with six programmes, viz., Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce. Later, P.G programme in 3-year M.B.A. was introduced from the academic session 2010-2013 with the institutional approval from Distance Education Council (DEC). Subsequently with the introduction of the subject-wise approval, the 2-year MBA programme was approved by Distance Education Bureau (DEB) vide Letter No. UGC/DEB/WB/BU/2013/Vol-II/67 dated 2nd September, 2015. The Executive Council of The University of Burdwan in its meeting on 19.01.2021 passed the resolution to rename. The Directorate of Distance Education' as per UGC Notification (4th September 2020) as Centre for Distance and Online Education(CDOE)'. Accordingly, the matter has been placed before the University Court for approval.

A. Programme Mission and Objectives:

To provide, subject to fulfillment of minimum eligibility criteria and other requirements as may
be prescribed by the university from time to time, wider access to higher education to persons of
all age and sex residing in any part of the country – particularly to working persons – who, for
different reasons, cannot pursue the higher study as regular full-time students of any university.

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- To provide a system of student-centric learning atmosphere, which will neither be entirely separate from nor wholly independent of the formal, full-time campus system of education as is traditionally followed in post graduate department of studies in any university.
- The Post Graduate Programme in Business Administration at the Centre for Distance and Online Education, The University of Burdwan is consistent with the spirit of MBA curriculum in regular mode. The objectives are in line with this mission i.e., to invoke the interest of the learners in Management education and to impart in them a holistic and comprehensive understanding of the subject.

B. Relevance of the Programme with HEI's Mission & Goals:

The P.G Programme in Business Administration needs little justification when it comes to ascertaining its relevance to the Programmes offered by any HEI. The post graduate programme of MBA at the Centre for Distance and Online Education had been developed the consistency with the curriculum of the regular mode. Subsequently with the introduction of the Choice - Based Credit System (CBCS), the curriculum for the MBA programme under ODL mode, offered by the CDOE, The University of Burdwan has been changed and made exactly the same as that of regular mode. Hence, the goal of introduction of such programme is to equip the distance learners with the best of existing knowledge as well as making them ready for the job market.

In accordance with the advice of the UGC Distance Education Bureau – that at least 50% of the disciplines taught in the Distance Learning must be with the same syllabus and same examination system of the regular course of the University, - MBA has been selected as one such course among all M.A/ M.Sc./M.Com/ MBA courses that had been running under the aegis of the Directorate of Distance Education. So, the new CBCS syllabus that University of Burdwan. had been introduced in regular MBA programme from 2014 - 2016 session was given effect at par in the Distance Mode. So, from the session (July 2019 - June 2021), the syllabus in accordance with latest UGC Guidelines is currently in force in the MBA (CBCS Distance Mode) as well. Also

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, the same examination system (same examination question papers, same dates of endpenestons examination, same Post Graduate Board of Studies) is in force in the distance mode of MBA discipline since (July 2019 - June 2021) session. However, since curriculum modification takes place after every five years in the regular mode programmes, there has been a modification in the CBCS curriculum from the session (2020 - 2022). So, once the affiliation from the UGC - DEB is obtained, the new batch of MBA students under distance mode will undertake their studies under the revised CBCS curriculum.

C. Nature of Prospective Target Group of Learners:

Learners who are unable to avail of the opportunity for MBA in regular mode for any reasons or working professionals who intend to upgrade their qualifications while retaining their jobs are the ideal candidates for this MBA program in Distance mode.

The unique design of this programme will equip the learners with tools and skills to maneuver successfully to cope up with the unstable needs of the corporate sector operating in a VUCA world. The course is geared towards providing a comprehensive knowledge of the curriculum, developing a holistic idea about current business problems - related to marketing, finance, human

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resource and, systems, operations and decision science, developing problem solving and decision making insights. The appropriateness of the programme to be conducted in Open and Distance Learning and /or Online mode has been ensured in terms of design, eligibility criteria, admission procedure, duration, evaluation, project work etc. This programme under Centre for Distance and Online Education is suitable for the early and mid career professionals working in West Bengal, that is the territorial jurisdiction of the University.

Instructional delivery mechanism: iv.

The approach followed will be a modern ICT enabled instruction mode. This is a learner oriented system of education for professionals. Here the learners play an active role. Many of the instructions will be given

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through distance mode, and not by face – to – face communication. The following is the combination of delivery mechanism for this course:

- Self Learning Material (SLM): The printed material of the courses in the form of Self Learning Material (SLM) are supplied to the students during their enrollment to this course. SLM s are approved by the Post Graduate Board of Studies in Management.
- Audio Visual Aids: The Centre for Distance and Online Education has already implemented audio visual aids to conduct classes.
- Audio Visual Material Aids: Learners are sometimes provided with Video lectures of the course. A video programme is normally of 1 hour duration. Learners may also be provided with various industrial videos of educational nature.

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MBA consists of 34 courses in all. Of these 31 are theory courses, each carrying 100 marks. The student is required to obtain 102 credits from the different areas along with two compulsory special courses, viz (i) Summer Internship Project (SIP) and (ii) Comprehensive Report (CR). Each of the courses in the identified areas carries 3 credits. Summer Internship Project (SIP) and Comprehensive Report (CR) carry 3 credits each. The credit distribution for the programme is as follows:

- 1. 54 credits from 18 core courses @ 3 credits per course (excluding Summer Internship Project) and Comprehensive Report (CR).
- 2. 40 credits from different elective courses as follows:
 - o 27 credits from 9 elective courses, exclusively from one of the four specialization areas viz.
 - (A) Marketing Management (B) Financial Management (C) Human Resource Management
 - (D) Systems, Operations and Decision Science
 - 9 credits from 3 elective courses from:
 - Areas excluding specialization areas, and
 - ii. Emerging areas.

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Under the Semester System Examinations (written), 20% of the total marks of the 100 paper are Internal Assessment. The Internal Assessment mark is given on the basis of attendance(25%) and assignment/class test/Viva/ Term Paper/ Presentation etc (75%). 80% of the total marks of the 100 marks paper are reserved for written examination to be held per semester.

- Summer Internship Project (SIP) of 4 to 6 weeks duration with an industrial/ business/ service / social organization is compulsory. The SIP report will carry 80 marks and the viva voce to be conducted on the SIP will carry 20 marks.
- Course MBA 4103 (Comprehensive Report) will be segregated into 3 components:
 - A. Final Project Study 100 marks (Project Report 80 Marks, Project Viva 20 marks)
 - B. Grand Viva 50 marks
 - C. Industry Visit 50 marks (Industry Visit Report 40 marks, Viva Voce 10 marks)
- Community Engagement Course (MBA 4104) Community engagement activities are based on components like visits to villages and identification of socio economic issues on rural livelihood, serving interests of informal workers, career counseling for the students of the excluded group, participation in literacy camps and other types of activities as specified and approved by the department.

A few notable features of the rules governing the examination of Semester System P.G Course under distance mode:

- a) The examination of MBA is equally divided into 4-semester examinations. After completion of the relevant course work, the examinations are held as per schedule notified by Controller of Examinations from time to time.

Programme Project Report (PPR) for M.A in Philosophy (2022-2023)

Way back in 1994 when, the Higher Education Department Govt. West Bengal was searching for a State-aided University who would like to introduce Distance/ Correspondence Education in State and the University of Burdwan was the first to shoulder the responsibility. In ameeting of the Advisory Committee of the Vice-Chancellors of all state aided universities of West Bengal held on 27.10.1993, it was decided that the University of Burdwan will introduce Correspondence Courses (Vide letter no. 96(2)-Edn (U)/ 1U(C)-14/92, dated: 22.02.1994). Accordingly, the University of Burdwanreadily accepted the proposal to introduce the P.G courses through correspondence mode. In the 21st meeting of the Executive Council (1993-1994) of Burdwan University (held on 30th may 1994 vide Item no. 333 (AOM)(8), it was resolved that the University of Burdwan in accordance with its Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations and with the approval of the State Govt. be offered P.G. Courses through Distance mode leading to M.A/M.Com Degrees with six programs, viz., Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce. However, we would like to inform that the court approved the rename of The Directorate of Distance Education as Centre for Distance and Online Education(CDOE) as per UGC notification dated 4th September 2020.

A. Programme Mission and Objectives:

To provide subject to fulfillment of minimum eligibility criteria and other requirements as may be prescribed by the university from time to time, wider access to higher education to persons of all ages and sexes residing in any part of the country - particularly to working persons - who, for different reasons, cannot avail the opportunity of higher study as regular full-time students of a university. To provide a system of student-centric learning atmosphere which will neither be entirely separated from nor wholly independent of the formal, full-time campus system of education as traditionally followed in university department of studies.

The Post Graduate Programme in Philosophy at the Centre for Distance and Online Education(CDOE), The University of Burdwan is in keeping with sprit of Philosophy curricula with regular mode of university. The objectives are in keeping with this mission i.e., to instill interest in the learner and take him through the ages of literary history via their landmark authors and their texts. The Programme was started on and from 1994 (academic session 1993-1995).

B. Relevance of the Programme with HEI's Mission & Goals:

The relevance of the PG course in Philosophy under ODL mode of Education will provide the connectivity between the Institution and the learners, the identification and nurturing of talent,

Regular Mode of Education is not sufficient enough to reach this goal. Introducing Post Graduate Course in Philosophy through distance mode of education we can reach to the unreached. The P.G Programme in Philosophy needs little justification when it comes to ascertaining its relevance to the Programme offered by any HEI. The P.G Programme at our CDOE has also kept in touch with the curriculum of the regular mode of the University. Hence, the goal of the introduction of such programme is to equip the distance learners with the best of existing knowledge as well as making them ready for the job market.

C. Nature of Prospective Target Group of Learners:

It aims for the development of knowledge modules having the right content to take care of the aspirations of academic community and to address to the personalized needs of the learners under low level of disposable income, rural dwellers, women, unskilled men, minorities etc. Students who graduated themselves and also do not find an opportunity to go for post graduate studies in regular mode of education due to the limitation of seats, we will offer them the best of the opportunity by offering the subject at post graduate level. However, the 2-yr. P.G Programme in Philosophy offered to Philosophy Hons., General Graduates with Philosophy as combination and M.A in a subject willing to M.A in Philosophy except M.A in any Professional subject.

- D. Appropriateness of the programme to be conducted in the ODL mode toacquiring specific skills and competence:Burdwan University emphasized in innovative approach towards curriculum designing, while conforming to the basic or core requirements to create a common knowledge base for the state and the nation. Post graduate programme in Philosophy to be offered through ODL mode will have certain learning outcomes. This programme will help the learners to spread higher education in all sectors of community.
 - Capacity building among the students particularly from the rural population.

E. Instructional Design: Philosophy:

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- Curriculum design: The curriculum in M.A. in Philosophy is designed by a committee comprising experts from the parent department of The University of Burdwan along with external expert keeping in view the needs of the diverse group of learners. Besides that, different experienced external faculty often takes PCP classes in Philosophy. Students who will be admitted in this course will also get help from them. PCP, on a regular basis, will be conducted by this experienced faculties member. Resource Persons for the Study Centers to conduct PCP in this course will be selected from the university to maintain the quality of the education as per university grant commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020.

The University of Burdwan, a public university located in Purba Bardhaman, West Bengal, was established by the West Bengal Government as a teaching and affiliating university on 15th June, 1960. P.G Courses through Distance mode leading to M.A/M.Com Degrees with six programmes, viz., Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce would be offered.

1. Programme's Mission and Objectives:

- To provide education facilities to all qualified and willing persons: The objective of correspondence courses is to provide education facilities to all qualified and willing persons who are unable to join regular university and other courses due tovarious reasons. For them, there is an incessant search for an alternative system and that system is distanceeducation.

The NPE-1986 says, "Life-long education is a cherished goal of the educational process. This presupposes universal literacy. Opportunities will be provided to the youth, housewives, agricultural and industrial workers and professionals to continue the education of their choice, at the pace suited to them. The future thrust will be in the direction of open and distance learning."

The distance learning system must be well-supported with instructional materials, and suitable radio and television programmes in different areas of study. This correspondence education or distance learning is becoming popular and being accepted as an alternative and economical approach to our formal educationsystem.

However, in the last few years, there has been a significant drop in tuition fees, primarily in secondary schools and colleges, due to the introduction of the distance education option. Namely, not only did the tuition fees drop because the school/educational institution's facilities and inventory were no longer used, but the expenses related to food, accommodation and all the other needs students have on a daily basis dropped as well. So, if you don't have enough money for a quality education, you should consider distance education.

A few notable features of the rules governing the examination of Semester System P.G.

- The examination of M.A. is divided into four semester examinations which hold as per schedule notified by Controller of Examinations from time to time after completion of its relevantPCP.
- A candidate shall get three consecutive chances including the original one to appear in a semester, within a total period of four years calculated from the year of admission to the course during which he/she has to complete the course. The chance not availed of by a candidate shall be deemed to have lapsed. The result of the 4th semester (Final) examination shall be kept withheld (RW) unless the candidate has cleared all the previous semesters.

Preparation of SLMs: In 1999 first 3 Day workshop was organized by our Directorate with the financial Assistance of DEC. In this workshop regular faculty members of our University as well as other Universities participated. Prof. V. S. Prasad, former Pro-Vice-Chancellor of IGNOU and Dr. Santosh Panda, Director, STRIDE acted as Resource persons in the said workshop. Then several subject-wise seminars and workshops were organized by the Directorate of Distance Education (DDE), The University of Burdwan(B.U.). Accordingly as per direction of university authority, a number of writers of SLMs of all the subjects/programmes were appointed and also Editorial Boards, Format Editors and General Editors of all the subjects/programmes were formed by the direction of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. The entire process was approved by the Advisory Committee of DDE, B.U. and Vice-Chancellor. After Publication of the SLMs, two sets of all study materials were sent to DEC for approval as per their direction. In February, 2013, an Expert Team from DEC visited our Directorate and the members thoroughly checked all study materials and they appreciated the whole process. In view of their recommendation, few months later, the letter of recognition of the programme as well as approval of SLMs was sent by DEB (Vide letter no. UGC/DEB/Recog/2013/1203-1207, dated: 21st August, 2015).

Updated notification for its learners: CDOE notifies its various policies for the programme delivery along with the details of methods and web-based tools adopted in the official website. All academic notifications are being carried out by the CDOE during the academic session through the official website (www.dde.buruniv.ac.in) and to the learners through SMS. Further, the CDOE notifies result and related information of examination evaluation through its official website and registered mobile number of the learners.

Programme Project Report (PPR) for M.A in Sanskrit 2022-2023

The University of Burdwan, a State university located in Purba Bardhaman, West Bengal, was established by the West Bengal Government as a teaching and affiliating university on 15th June, 1960. The Directorate of Distance Education (DDE), was established by The University of Burdwan. It was the first of its kind in West Bengal to cater education through distance/correspondence mode and eventually, it evolved as an independent centre for learning. Situated in Golapbag, Burdwan, at present, this centre has a beautiful building of its own that houses all the administrative and academic departments. It also holds counselling sessions for the different courses it runs.

Way back in 1994 when, the Higher Education Department Govt. West Bengal was searching for a State-aided University who would like to introduce Distance/ Correspondence Education in State, The University of Burdwan was the first to shoulder the responsibility. In a meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Vice-Chancellors of all state aided universities of West Bengal held on 27.10.1993, it was decided that the University of Burdwan will introduce Correspondence Courses (Vide letter no. 96(2)-Edn (U)/ 1U(C)-14/92, dated: 22.02.1994). Accordingly, the University of Burdwan readily accepted the proposal to introduce the P.G courses through correspondence mode. In the 21st meeting of the Executive Council (1993-1994) of Burdwan University [held on 30th may 1994 vide Item no.333(AOM)/(8)], it was resolved that the university of Burdwan in accordance with its Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations and with the approval of the State Govt. be offered P.G Courses through Distance mode leading to M.A/M.Com Degrees with six programmes, viz.,Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy and Commerce. Later, The Directorate introduced M.A Programme in Sanskrit from the academic session 2004-2006 as per decision of the Executive Council considering the feasibility of offering M.A. in Sanskrit under DDE (ODL mode) in its meeting held on 10.08.2004 vide Item No. AOM-81(11)

The Executive Council of The University of Burdwan in its meeting on 19.01.2021 passed the resolution to rename 'The Directorate of Distance Education' as per UGC Notification (4th September 2020) to 'Centre for Distance and Online Education(CDOE)'. Accordingly, the matter has been placed before the court for approval.

The Programme was started on and from 2004 (academic session 2004-2006).

2. Relevance of the Programme with HEI's Mission & Goals:

The P.G Programme in Sanskrit Literature needs little justification when it comes to ascertaining its relevance to the Programme offered by any HEI. The P.G Programme at our CDOE has also kept in touch with the curriculum of the regular mode of the University. Hence, the goal of the introduction of such programme is to equip the distance learners with the best of existing knowledge as well as making them ready for the job market.

3. Nature of Prospective Target Group of Learners:

For the present subject the following groups of learners have been targeted:

- (1) Those are distracted from the admission in the regular mode due to limited intake capacity of The University of Burdwan and other HEIs
- (2) Those employed in various organizations who desire to track higher education as a passion or as a means for movement up the promotional ladder.

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- (3) Drop outs primarily due to social, financial and economic compulsions as well as population related factors.
- (4) Rural population those who are living in remote areas where higher education institutes are not easily accessible.
- (5) Job seekers of particular field of Sanskrit. People of any age can participate in higher education programmes as there is no age bar in ODL mode education.

4. Appropriateness of programme to be conducted in Open and Distance Learning:

The University of Burdwan emphasized in innovative approach towards curriculum designing, while conforming to the basic or core requirements to create a common knowledge base for the state and the nation. Post graduate Programme in Arts, Commerce and Science to be offered through ODL mode will have certain learning outcomes. This programme will help the learners to spread higher education in all sectors of community.

- Capacity building among the students particularly from the rural population as well as backward areas of the districts
- To apply skills and knowledge in an internship experience
- To develop skills on hand practical related to science subject and also hands on training in field exposure

The Distance learning under The University of Burdwan offer programme in an expanded mode both in volume and the type of programmes. As technology has been getting more affordable and widely available, the interest of both learners and institutions in this special kind of education may be increased enormously. This programme distinguishes itself from others in the field, as it prioritizes research by enabling the student to access knowledge from Sanskrit classical texts and Indian Knowledge Traditions, such that they may use this knowledge for furthering their studies in either their own specializations or in new areas that they may become interested in. Furthermore, this course will also provide students with the requisite knowledge to be able to teach the Sanskrit language and related courses in the future. This programme is thus unique in not only providing students with the needful ability in research and teaching, thus enabling them to benefit from the numerous opportunities arising in these areas, but also in laying a good platform for their successful professional and spiritual life. The relevance and importance of Sanskrit is not just restricted to culture and academics. Some of the major fields that Sanskrit students can

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accept teaching, research and civil services as their career. The followings are the relevance of the programme:

- To build bridges between the Ancient Indian knowledge systems and the current knowledge systems.
- To explore Ancient literature, customs, sciences and technologies with a modern perspective to build alternate viable systems for the future.
- To train learners in order to undertake research in application oriented knowledge mining and/or Online mode to acquire specific skills and competence.

5. Instructional Design:

The first step of instructional design in distance mode is curriculum design. A growing number of students globally are enrolling in distance education programme and it is becoming important now, more than ever before, to design curriculum that reflects educational principles, represents elements of engagement and pedagogy and meets institutional and industrial requirements. In doing so, it is vital to design contemporary curriculum that ensures these outcomes are attained. In order to effectively design curriculum, the role of the educator as a conductor, technician and choreographer. Finally, a triad has been proposed comprising of pedagogy, technology and an engaged community of learners as a basis for ensuring curriculum meets contemporary practices. For All these subjects the objective of this Open & Distance Learning (ODL) system of education is to develop capacity within and across the region to organize distance learning effectively in order to address the educational challenges and opportunities, particularly in higher education.

i) Curriculum Design:

The curriculum in M. A. in Sanskrit is designed by a committee comprising experts from the parent department of the The University of Burdwan along with external expert keeping in view the needs of the diverse groups of learners. The syllabus is prepared by the Subject Committee (PGBS) is placed in the Advisory Committee of Centre for Distance and Online Education, formerly known as Directorate of Distance Education for approval. Then the syllabus is uploaded in the website of the university.

In consideration to the letter regarding introduction of common examination (same question paper) for Regular and ODL programme w.e.f July 2019 [the dual mode HEIs shall conduct common exam(same question paper) for 50% of the total recognized programmes for academic

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session (July/January as defined in the regulations) in which both the intakes (conventional and ODL) are taken. This shall be implemented from Academic session July 2019 and onwards.] with file No 1-23/2018(DEB-1) April, 2019 from Smita Badani, Education Officer, DEB, UGC. the Executive Council of The University of Burdwan in Item no 342 dated 2nd January 2020 resolved the issue of introduction of CBCS system for 50% programmes under Centre for Distance and Online Education, The University of Burdwan. As per the resolution of Executive Council, the CBCS system is introduced in Master of Commerce, MBA, M.Sc. in Mathematics, M.Sc. in Computer Science, and M.A. in Political Science. The rest of the programmes like M.A. in Bengali, M.A. in English, M.A. in Sanskrit, M.A. in Philosophy, M.A. in History and B.Ed. will follow the year wise (i.e. Part I and Part II) system.

a) Self Learning Materials (SLM): The printed Materials of the programme in the form of Self Learning Materials (SLM) will be supplied to the students during their enrollment to the course.

Preparation of SLMs:

In 1999 first 3 Day workshop was organized by our CDOE formerly known as DDE with the financial Assistance of DEC. In this workshop all regular faculty members of our University as well as other Universities were participated. Prof. V. S. Prasad, former Pro-Vice-Chancellor of IGNOU and Dr. Santosh Panda, Director, STRIDE was acted as Resource persons in the said workshop. Then several subject-wise seminars and workshops were organized by the Centre for Distance and Online Education, formerly known as Directorate of Distance Education (DDE), Burdwan University (B.U) in this regard. Accordingly, as per direction of university authority a number of writers of SLMs of all the subjects/programmes were appointed, and also Editorial Boards, Format Editors and General Editors of all the subjects/programmes were formed by the direction of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. The entire process was approved by the Advisory Committee of DDE, B.U. and Vice-Chancellor. After Publication of the SLMs following such a manner, two sets of all study materials were sent to DEC for approval as per their direction. In February, 2013, an Expert Team from DEC visited our Directorate and the members thoroughly checked all study materials and they appreciated the whole process. In view of their recommendation, few months later, the letter of recognition of the programme as well as approval of SLMs was sent by DEB (Vide letter no. UGC/DEB/Recog/2013/1203-1207, dated: 21st August, 2015).

 certificate of 3 year course securing at least 35% marks in aggregate (in concerned
 Hons.subject), or
 - A minimum 2nd class Hons. (Regular or Special) graduate in the relevant subject having pursued the course of the old 11+3 pattern, or
 - A pass graduate in the 10+2+3 pattern having offered the relevant subject as a combination / elective one (of not less than 300 marks at the degree stage) securing at least 30% marks in it, or,
 - B.Sc, / B.Com. / B.A. Pass Graduates who subsequently passed Special B.A. (of not less than 300 marks in the relevant subject) securing at least 30% marks in it, or
 - A pass graduate in the 10+2+2 / 10+1+3 / 11+3 pattern from any recognized institute who subsequently passed 1 year Bridge Course in the relevant subject (of not less than 300 marks at the degree level) and thus became equivalent to a pass graduate of 10+2+3 pattern securing at least 40% marks in it, or
 - An M.A. in a subject willing to do M.A. in any other subject offered through Distance Mode irrespective of whether or not that subject was offered by him / her at the degree stage, provided that no M.A. in any professional subject like Music, Drama, Film Studies, Physical Education (M.P.Ed.), General Education (M.Ed.) etc. is entitled to this special provision. c) Evaluation: Term-end Examinations (written)

20% of the total marks of the paper is Internal Assessment (MCQ type).

80% of the total marks of the paper would be reserved for written examination to be held at the end of the 1^{st} year (Part – I) & at the end of 2^{nd} year (Part – II).

A few notable features of the rules governing the examination of P.G Course under distance mode:

- a) A P.G (Two-year) course of studies shall be equally divided into two parts as per the approved syllabus in the subject concerned: Part I and Part II, each spanning one academic year. The Part –I Examination under these Regulations shall be held at the end of the first academic year after the commencement of the session and the Part II Examination shall be held at the end of the second academic year.
 - b) A student who has been admitted to the P.G course of study under CDOE formerly known as DDE and has completed the course work of studies in the subjects as to be prescribed or may be prescribed by the CDOE formerly known as DDE of this University from time to time may be admitted to the Part 1 Examination at end of the first academic year and to the Part II Examination at the end of the second academic year subject to the conditions stipulated by the Directorate.
