# SCHEME OF DISTANCE EDUCATION

# 1. Objectives:

The principal objectives of distance education as introduced by The University of Burdwan are:

- (a) To provide, subject to fulfilment of minimum eligibility criteria and other requirements as may be prescribed by the University from time to time, wider access to higher education to persons of all ages and sexes residing in any part of the country particularly to working persons who, for different reasons, cannot prosecute the higher studies as regular full-time students of a University;
- (b) To provide a system of student-centric learning atmosphere which will neither be entirely separate from nor wholly independent of the formal, full-time campus system of education as traditionally followed in University departments of studies; and
- (c) To provide means of improvement/upgradation of professional skills and competence of individuals who wish to take education as a life-long activity.
  - Keeping all these objectives in mind six post-graduate courses leading to M.A./M.Com. degrees were offered by this Directorate, for the first time in the State, through correspondence mode in 1994 for the academic session 1993-95 in accordance with the Act, Statutes, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations of the University and with the approval of the Government of West Bengal. At present we are offering eight post-graduate courses under distance mode.

#### 1.1 Courses offered: \*

- a) 2-year P. G. Courses leading to M.A. degree in the following subjects: (1) Bengali, (2) English, (3) History, (4) Philosophy, (5) Political Science and (6) Sanskrit.
- b) 2-year P. G. Course leading to M.A./M.Sc. degree in **Mathematics**
- c) 2-year P. G. Course leading to M.Sc. degree in Computer Science and
- d) 2-year P. G. Course leading to **M.Com.** degree.
- **1.2** Students applying for admission to any programme under this Directorate may note that after their successful completion of the course, the University will clearly mention that the degree / certificate has been obtained through Distance Education mode.

<sup>\*</sup>Candidates are no longer permitted by the University, to appear at the M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. examinations in these subjects as external students.





#### 1.3 Pattern/Duration/Syllabi:

The D.D.E. largely follows the syllabi and courses of studies of the regular programme in the University. The duration of P.G Courses is two years divided into Part-I and Part-II, and for M.A. / M.Sc. course in Mathematics and M.Sc. in Computer Science, it is divided into 4-semesters. Brief outlines of the syllabi are provided in the Appendix..Subject-wise syllabus will be supplied free of charge from D.D.E. at the time of delivering study materials.

# 2. Eligibility for admission

#### A) Eligibility for admission to the M.A. courses:

The following categories of students, under the terms and conditions mentioned against them, are eligible to apply for admission to the M.A. Courses:

- (i) a minimum 2nd Class Honours (Regular or Special) Graduate in the relevant subject having pursued the course in the 10+2+3 pattern from any recognized university; or
- (ii) an unsuccessful Honours Graduate of the above pattern (a) who after having pursued the Honours Course at the Part-I, Part-Il & Part-Ill stages obtained **Pass Degree Certificate of the Three-year Course securing at least 35% marks in aggregate** (in Honours Subject concerned); or
- (iii) a minimum 2nd Class Honours (Regular or Special) Graduate in the relevant subject having pursued the course under the old 11+3 pattern; or
- (iv) a Pass Graduate in the 10+2+3 pattern having offered the relevant subject as a combination / elective one (of not less than 300 marks) at the degree stage securing at least 40% marks in it; or
- (v) a B.Sc./B.Com./B.A. Pass Graduate who subsequently passed Special B.A. (of not less than 300 marks in the relevant subject) securing at least 40% marks in it; or
- (vi) a Pass Graduate in the 10+2+2/10+1+3/11+3 pattern from any recognized institute who subsequently passed One-year Bridge Course in the relevant subject (of not less than 300 marks at the degree stage) and thus became equivalent to a Pass Graduate of 10+2+3 pattern, securing **at least 40% marks** in it; or
- (vii) an M.A. in a subject willing to do M.A. in any other subject offered through distance mode irrespective of whether or not that subject was studied by him / her at the degree stage, provided that the M.A. is not in any professional subject like Music, Drama, Film Studies, Physical Education (M.P.Ed.), General Education (M. Ed.) etc. Further no M.A. in "Islamic History and Culture" or "Ancient History and Culture" from any university is entitled to do M.A. again in History from this University. An M.A in a subject from another university can not do MA in the same subject through this Directorate.

#### B) Eligibility for admission to the M.A. / M.Sc. course in Mathematics :

The following categories of students under the terms and conditions mentioned against them are eligible to apply for admission to the M.A./M.Sc. course in Mathematics:





- (i) a minimum 2nd Class Honours (Regular or Special) Graduate in Mathematics having pursued the course in the 10+2+3 pattern from any recognized University; or
- (ii) an unsuccessful Honours Graduate of the above pattern (a) who after having pursued the Honours Course in Mathematics at the Part-I, Part-II & Part-III stages obtained **Pass Degree Certificate of the Three-year Course securing at least 35% marks in aggregate** (in Honours Subject); or
- (iii) a minimum 2nd Class Honours (Regular or Special) Graduate in Mathematics having pursued the course under the old 11+3 pattern, or
- (iv) a B.A./B.Sc. Pass Graduate in the 10+2+3 pattern having offered Mathematics as combination / elective subject (of not less than 300 Marks) at the Degree stage securing **at least 50% marks** in it; or
- (v) a B.A./ B.Sc. Pass Graduate in the 10+2+2/10+1+3/11+3 pattern from any recognized institute, who subsequently passed One-year Bridge Course in Mathematics (of not less than 300 marks at the degree stage) and thus became equivalent to a Pass Graduate of 10+2+3 pattern securing **at least 40% marks** in it.

#### C) Eligibility for admission to the M.Sc. course in Computer Science :

B.Sc. Hons. in Computer Science/BCA/BE or equivalent/B.Sc.(Hon.) in Mathematics/Stat/Electronics/Physics/Chemistry with Computer Science as one of the combination subject/DOEAC A-level or equivalent/PGDCA from State Council of Technical Education of Govt. of West Bengal.

#### D) Eligibility for admission to the M.Com. course :

The following categories of students under the terms and conditions mentioned against them are eligible to apply for admission to the M. Com. course:

- (i) a minimum second Class Honours (Regular or Special) graduate in Commerce having pursued the course in the 10+2+3 pattern from any recognized University; or
- (ii) an unsuccessful Honours candidate of the above pattern (a) but who after having pursued the Honours Course in Commerce at the Part-I, Part-Il & Part-Ill stages obtained Pass Degree Certificate of the Three year Course securing at least 35% marks in aggregate (in Honours Subject); or
- (iii) a minimum 2nd Class Honours (Regular or Special) Graduate in Commerce under the old 11+3 pattern; or
- (iv) a Pass Commerce Graduate in the 10+2+3 pattern securing a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate; or
- (v) a Pass Commerce Graduate in the 10+2+2/10+1+3/11+3 pattern from any recognized institute, who subsequently passed One-year Bridge Course in Commerce and thus became equivalent to a Pass Graduate of 10+2+3 pattern securing **at least 40% marks** in it.





# 3. Submission of Admission Form:

Candidates are to submit the duly filled in application form at:

No applications are received at the Kolkata Camp Office. They must enclose with the filled in form the following:

- (a) evidence of payment of course fee after making it in the manner prescribed in section 18 of the Prospectus;
- (b) self-signed photocopy of the Admit Card of the Madhyamik / Secondary Examination;
- ©) self-signed photocopies of Marksheets of all the previous public examinations passed;
- (d) self-signed photocopy of the Registration Certificate of the University of Burdwan (instantly applicable to former students of this University)
- (e) self-signed photocopy of the Caste Certificate (applicable in case of OBC/SC/ST/Minority candidates only) and certificate of physical handicap.\*
- (f) one stamp size (colour) **unattested** recent photograph with Name & Form No. written on the back. The photograph is to be inserted in the big yellow envelope supplied.
- 3.1 What to affix on and return with the form:
- (a) Candidates must affix one self-signed recent stamp size photograph in the appropriate space provided.
- (b) They must return all the envelopes supplied to them including the large brown envelope after affixing neatly-typed / computer-printed stickers/slips of their mailing address on the right hand bottom / marked spaces of the envelopes. They must also mention the subject at the right hand top corner of the large brown envelope. **Incomplete applications are liable to be cancelled.**

# 4. Migration and Registration of students from other universities: \*\*

Students of other universities seeking admission to M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. courses must get themselves registered under this University by November 2013 for Mathematics & Computer Science Programmes by February 2014 for M.A./M.Com. courses at the latest, failing which their admission is liable to be cancelled. After obtaining the Enrolment Number from the

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Directorate they will also be required to submit application, through prescribed form (one for Inward Migration and the other for regular Registration), to be downloaded from the Directorate Website for registration along with self-signed documents like-

- (i) photocopy of the Marksheet of the last examination passed i.e., B.A./B.Sc/B.Com./ Bridge course/M.A. etc. (as the case may be),
- (ii) photocopy of the Admit Card of Madhyamik/Secondary Examination,
- (iii) photocopy of the Enrolment Card of the Directorate,
- (iv) a self-signed attested passport size photograph to be affixed on the space provided in the form,
- (v) photo copy of the challan (Student copy) of course fee as proof of deposit of the requisite fee of Rs.150/- Candidates will be required to furnish migration certificate in original from the university last attended. Candidates must submit the forms completed in all respects personally at the Directorate or Study Centres. Submission of forms by post to the Directorate is not allowed.

# 5. Restoration of Registration Number of former B.U. students:

Burdwan University graduates who meanwhile migrated to any other University for academic reasons, must get their original B.U. Registration Number restored by November 2013 for Mathematics & Computer Science Programmes by February 2014 for M.A./M.Com. Courses in the manner as stipulated in the relevant University rules. However, they will be required to submit the Restoration form to be downloaded from the Directorate website for Restoration furnishing Migration Certificate in original from the University last attended alongwith original B.U. Registration Certificate. They must submit the attested Photocopy of the Registration certificate to the Directorate as soon as they receive it in the 'Restored' form.

# **6 Documents for Finalization of Admission:**

- (A) In order to appear in the examination a candidate must fill up a form & submit it along with photo copy of the challan (Student copy) of course fee as proof of deposit of the requisite fee of Rs.50/- during the PCP failing which he/she will not be allowed to appear in the examination.
- (B) Verification of Original Documents for Finalization of Admission:

Until the University is satisfied about a candidate's minimum eligibility for admission on verification of his/her **ORIGINAL** documents, **his/her enrolment remains purely provisional and may be cancelled on the ground of non-fulfilment of minimum eligibility criteria.** Students will therefore be required to produce the original documents (copies of which must have been submitted with the application form for admission) for verification on such dates as will be





notified. Candidates are advised to note that their Admit Cards for appearing at the Examination will in no case be issued until all the original credentials which compulsorily include the B. U. Registration Certificate, are verified for finalization of their admission.

#### 7. Cancellation of admission on other grounds:

Apart from the non-fulfilment of basic eligibility criteria, admission of a student may be cancelled by the University (without refund of the course fee deposited) on any of the grounds mentioned below:

- (i) if there is any suppression of information or detection of false information supplied at any stage after admission;
- (ii) for gross misconduct / indiscipline; and
- (iii) for adoption of unfair means at the examination hall, Candidates themselves may, however, choose to discontinue their studies at any point of time for private reasons and apply for withdrawal or cancellation of their admission / enrolment. While the University may not object to granting any such prayer, no claim for refund of course fee will be entertained in any case as per University rules.

# 8. Mode of Instruction:

Unlike regular programmes in the University departments this Distance Programme is self-paced and learner-centred. It will essentially be based on the supply of reading materials for home study by the learner. Face-to-face contact sessions may also be arranged by the University for the purpose of academic counselling to the students.

# 9. Study Materials:

Printed study materials are prepared by experts and eminent scholars in the subjects and will be supplied personally to the candidates at the time of admission. While these Self Learning Materials (SLMs) should give the students the required academic guidance, they are advised to supplement their reading at home by thoroughly going through the prescribed texts at least. Wherever available, they should also consult the suggested reference books.

#### **10. Assignments:**

Wherever felt necessary, assignments on lessons / units may be sent to students. They may send answers to such assignments to the Directorate. These assignments will be checked and marked by subject teachers with a view to assessing the progress of the





students in their self-study. These Tutor-Marked Assessments will be sent to them in due course. However, the marks thus obtained will not count towards the results of the term-end examinations of the students.

# 11. Personal Contact Programmes:

Strictly need-based Personal Contact Programmes (PCPs) may be arranged by the Directorate to principally facilitate face-to-face interaction between the students and our subject teachers who give due academic counselling to the students. These face-to-face contact sessions will be arranged at our all centre. The duration of these sessions may vary from subject to subject. Students will be duly informed of the formalities to be completed by them.

# 12. Medium of Instruction:

Except for English, Commerce & Mathematics the study materials of other subjects will be supplied in Bengali.

# **14. Admit Cards and Examination:**

Admit cards will be issued to the candidates after due verification of their original credentials in the manner given in section 6. These **Admit Cards** along with examination schedule for appearing at the Part-I/Sem-II or at the Part-II/Sem-III / Sem-III or at the Part-II/Sem-III or at the Part-II/Sem-IIII or at the Part-II/Sem-III or at the Part-II/Sem-III or at the Part-II/Sem-III or at the Part-II/Sem-III or at the Part-II/Sem-





IV examination have to be collected by the candidates personally. These are neither sent by post nor handed over to any authorized person. Examination will be held at Burdwan, Malda, Coochbehar, Birbhum & Bankura. Candidates will have to make their own arrangements for accommodation during PCPs & examinations.

# 15. Admission to Part-II/Sem-III & IV Course:

Admission to Part-II / Sem-III & IV courses is compulsory after the Part-I / Sem-II examinations are over. There is no scope for the students to wait for the results of their Part-I / Sem-II examinations. Irrespective of whether Part-I / Sem.-II results are declared, or they fail to obtain the qualifying marks in it, or they fail to appear at the examination, they would be required to submit the Part-II / Sem-III & IV forms along with the prescribed fees and other documents for continuation of studentship under the distance mode. The Part-II / Sem-III & IV forms are not priced and these will be supplied to them in due course Admission will have to be completed within the period stipulated by the Directorate.

# 16. A few notable features of the rules governing the examinations for M.A. /M.Com. Courses under Distance Mode:

- a) A PG (Two-year) course of studies shall be equally divided into two parts as per the approved syllabi in the subject concerned: Part-I and Part-II, each spanning one academic year. The Part-I Examination under these Regulations shall be held at the end of the first academic year after the commencement of the session and the Part-II Examination shall be held at the end of the Second academic year.
- b) A student who has been admitted to M.A./M.Com. course of studies under DDE and has completed the course work of studies in the subject as to be prescribed or may be prescribed by the DDE of this University from time to time may be admitted to the M.A./M.Com. Parti Examination at the end of the first academic year and to the Part-Il Examination at the end of the second academic year subject to the conditions stipulated by the Directorate.
- c) Subject to the fulfilment of the conditions stipulated by the Directorate of Distance Education of this University a student who, after prosecuting the course work [ i.e., Personal Contact Programmes (PCPs), Assignment, if any, etc as to be conducted by the Directorate] does not register himself/herself for or registers himself/herself for but fails to appear or appears at but fails to secure the qualifying marks as stipulated hereinafter at the M.A./M.Com. Part-I Examination(s) may be permitted to appear at the Part-I Examination/back (failed) papers at Part-I examination as the case may be along with the next year's Part-II Examination. However, he/she has to appear at the entire Part-I Examinations within the prescribed chances, if he/she fails to appear at Part-I Examinations/ appeared at but applied for cancellation of his/her entire Part-I Examinations in prescribed manner.

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However, no candidate shall be allowed to sit for the Part-Il examination without being enrolled at the Part-I examination in the previous year. Provided that -

- (i) failure to take Part-I Examination or to secure qualifying marks in Part-I Examinations will not debar a candidate from prosecuting his/her second year course of study;
- (ii) a student who appears at in part or in full the examination and intends to seek for cancellation of his M.A./ M.Com. Part-l/Part-ll Examination as the case may be, may apply to the Controller of Examinations for the same through the Director, Distance Education, B.U. within a fortnight from the last date of completion of the relevant examination and he/she may be permitted to appear at the M.A./M.Com. Part-l/Part-ll Examination afresh, if chance remains, on cancellation of his/her entire examination for the relevant part.(i.e., Part-I, Part-II)
- (iii) For any type of reappearance within the prescribed chances, the candidate must have to deposit the requisite reappearance fee as fixed or may be fixed by the University from time to time.
- d) (i) The Qualifying marks (Q.M.) for each paper shall be 35% in each part (i.e., Parti & Part-Il examinations). Credit will be retained paper-wise within the prescribed chances in each Part.
  - (ii) In order to pass the examination, a student must have to secure a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate (Part-I and Part-I examinations taken together) subject to securing the minimum qualifying marks (i.e, 35%) in each paper separately.
  - (iii) If a candidate secures qualifying marks in each paper at Part-I Examination but fails to secure a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate (Part-I and Part-Il Examinations taken together), he/she may reappear, if chance remains, in all the Papers or in Papers as per his/her choice along with back (failed) papers, if any, at the Part-Il examination to secure a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate (Part-I & Part-Il examinations taken together).
  - (iv) If a candidate fails to secure qualifying marks at Part-I examination he/she may appear at Part-Il examination along with his/her failed (back) papers at Part-I examination, if chance remains.
- e) A candidate shall have to complete Part-I and Part-Il Examinations within 4(four) consecutive years including his/her original enrolment in Part-I examination subject to the condition that not more than 3 (three) consecutive chances shall be allowed in each part.
  - If any of the chances mentioned above is not availed of by a candidate within the stipulated period, the chance shall be deemed to have lapsed.

#### **EXPLANATION:**

A student admitted to 1st year M.A./M.Com. class during the session 2013-15 shall get three consecutive chances to appear at the Part-I Examination of 2014, 2015, 2016 and at the Part-II Examination of 2015, 2016 and 2017.

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If a candidate fails to pass the examination within the prescribed chances, he/she will have to appear at the Part-I and Part-II Examinations de novo on fresh admission to the course, subject to usual terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the University for the academic session.

- f) If a candidate after securing qualifying marks at his/her Part-II examination, clears his/her Part-II examination/failed (back) paper(s) of Part-I examination in subsequent year within the prescribed chances and secures a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate (Part-II and Part-II taken together) he/she will be declared to have passed the final examination in the year in which he/she clears his/her back (failed) part.
- g) The Provisional results of each Part will be published stating only the total marks obtained by a candidate and the mark sheet will be issued showing the marks in each paper only to the examinee(s) concerned registered to this University. However, if a candidate fails to secure qualifying marks in a particular Part of examination, his/her result of next part will be declared as 'PNC' (i.e. Part Not Cleared).
- h) The final result of a candidate shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in Part-I and Part-Il examinations taken together. Subject to fulfilment of the conditions stipulated in the above Regulations a candidate who secures 35% marks in each paper of Part-I and Part-Il examination and
  - (i) Secures 40% or more but less than 60% marks in the aggregate on the combined results of the Part-I and Part-Il Examinations shall be declared to have passed MA./ M.Com. Examination in the Second Class,
  - (ii) Secures 60% marks or above in the aggregate on the combined results of the Part-I and Part-II Examinations shall be declared to have passed the M.A./M.Com. Examination in the First Class.

# Post Publication Review of Answer-scripts;

- (a) A candidate may apply for Post Publication Review of his/her answer-scripts in a maximum number of 50% of theoretical papers appeared in each part, irrespective of marks obtained by the candidate in those papers, provided he/she has secured at least 35% marks in aggregate of the remaining theoretical paper(s) not asked for Post Publication Review.
- (b) Application for Post Publication Review should be submitted in the prescribed form (obtainable from the Directorate of Distance Education) and manner along with requisite fees prescribed for the purpose within the date as per notification to be issued by the office of the Controller of Examinations.
- ©) Such applications shall be checked and verified by the Directorate of Distance Education in regard to eligibility of the candidates applying for review. All such applications must be forwarded by the Directorate/Asstt. Director of the Distance Education.
- (d) There shall be no Post Publication Review of Practical Paper/Term Paper/Project Paper, Viva-voce etc., if any.





- (e) Incomplete and faulty application is liable to be rejected without assigning any reason or without any intimation to the candidate concerned.
- (f) Under no circumstances fees for Post Publication Review once paid will be refunded.
- (g) Appearance in the next year's examination will not depend on whether a candidate has applied for Post Publication Review or not. Candidates applying for Post Publication Review shall have to make necessary preparations for the next examination on the basis of his/her original results.

In case of an unsuccessful candidate addition of marks on Post Publication Review in a paper shall be given effect to only when it leads to change in his/her result status prior to review position, otherwise the original award shall be retained and in that case no fresh marksheet will be issued to such a candidate.

Any addition or subtraction of marks as declared by the University after Post-Publication Review shall be binding on the candidate. No further application for consideration of the candidate's review results shall be entertained. II.

# A few notable features of the rules governing the examinations for M.A./M.Sc. Course in semester system under Distance Mode:

- a) The examination of M.A. / M.Sc. is equally divided into 4-semester and each semester examination after completion of its relevant course work will be held as per schedule to be notified by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.
- b) A candidate shall get three consecutive chances including the original one to appear in a semester, within a total period of four years calculated from the year of admission to the course during which he / she has to complete the course. The chance not availed of by a candidate shall be deemed to have lapsed. The result of the 4th semester (Final) examination shall be kept withheld (RW) unless a candidate has cleared all the previous semesters.

#### **EXPLANATION:**

A student admitted to M.A/M.Sc course in Mathematics during the session 2013-15 shall get three consecutive chances to appear at the Semester I Examination of December 2013, December 2014, December 2015; at the Semester II Examination of June 2014, June 2015, June 2016; at the Semester III Examination of December 2014, December 2015, December 2016 and at the Semester IV Examination of June 2016. June 2017.

c) Subject to fulfillment of the conditions stipulated, in the relevant 'Regulation' a student who does not register himself/ herself for reappearing at any semester examination or fails to appear at the examination, or appears at but fails to secure the qualifying marks as stipulated in any semester examinations may be permitted to continue studies in the next semester(s) as well as to appear at his / her due semester(s) examination within the prescribed chances along with reappearing at the back semester(s) examinations if any, provided chance remains after obtaining permission and



submission of re-appearing fees. If a candidate after qualifying his / her 4th (final) semester examination, clears his / her any previous back semester examinations within the prescribed chances, he / she would be declared to have passed the final examination in the year in which he / she clears his / her back semester.

- d) A student who appears at any semester examination in part or in full and intends to seek for cancellation of the same may apply for the said purpose to the Controller of Examinations, the University of Burdwan through Director, Distance Education within fifteen days from the date of completion of the theoretical paper(s) of the said examination. In that case the entire examination including practical paper(s), if any, would be treated as cancelled. He/ she may be permitted to appear at the relevant semester examination afresh in the succeeding year(s) if chance remains after obtaining permission from the Controller of Examinations.
- e) The pass marks for each Theoretical / Project Paper & Term Paper including allied Viva-Voce, if any, shall be 35%. Credit will be retained paper-wise within the prescribed chances in each semester.
- f) The provisional results of each semester will be published stating only the total marks obtained by a candidate & the marksheet would be issued showing the marks obtained in each paper. However, if a candidate fails to secure Qualifying (Pass) marks in a particular semester examination his / her result of the next semester examination(s) will be declared as 'SNC (i.e. Semester Not Cleared).
- g) A candidate may avail of the benefits of re-appearing upto 50% of theoretical papers in any semester examination for improvement of results once only in the immediately succeeding year provided chance remains and the marks of the said examination would be final and binding. The prayer for Post Publication Review (PPR) of answer scripts of the reappeared semester examinations (Improvement) will not be granted. However, in 4th-semester (Final) examination any lowering of marks as a consequence of the results of Improvement / Post Publication Review (PPR) will not affect the final results status of the candidate i.e., 1st Class / 2nd Class / 55% in aggregate decleared earlier.
- h) The final result of a candidate shall be determined on the basis of total marks obtained in all the semesters taken together.

# Rules Regarding Post Publication Review of Answer Scripts of M.A./M.Sc. Semester Examinations:

- A) i) A candidate may apply for Post Publication Review of his / her theoretical answer scripts upto 50% of total theoretical papers appeared in each semester in the prescribed form & manner and on submission of requisite fees. But he / she must have to secure a minimum of 35% in aggregate of the total marks in theoretical part of the particular semester examination.
  - ii) There will be no scope of Post Publication Review of Practical Paper(s)/Term Paper(s) / Project Paper(s)/ Internal Assessment/Viva-Voce/ Field Report/Survey Report, if any.
  - iii) Under no circumstances fees for Post Publication Review once paid shall be refunded.



- iv) A candidate after submission of prescribed application form for Post Publication Review of his / her answer script(s) in a semester will not be allowed to appear at the "Repeat Examination" for the paper(s) asked for Post Publication Review in the next year. In that case his / her Repeat Examination of the paper(s) will be treated as cancelled.
- B) For each paper, a requisite fee is to be deposited with the State Bank of India, DDE Complex, Golapbag, Burdwan through Challan to be supplied by the Directorate. Outstation candidates may enclose Demand Draft of the same amount drawn in favour of the "Directorate of Distance Education, The University of Burdwan" payable at SBI, Golapbag Branch, Burdwan.
- C) Acceptance of any change in marks (either increase or decrease) on Post Publication Review result as per rules will be binding on the candidate concerned.
- D) Application through a photocopy of the prescribed form will not be accepted in any case.
